**Notes:** The south portion of this site is rolling terrain with mainly aspen forest & dense shrubs; the north portion contains George Lake & consists of post-fire successional dense young aspen. George Lake NA lies in the Boreal Forest Natural Region, Dry Mixedwood Sub-region. The Dry Mixedwood Sub-region is the only Boreal Forest sub-region that does not have excellent representation within Alberta's parks and protected areas network. There are still significant shortfalls in the glacial lakebed, ground moraine, sandplain and sand dune natural history themes. Listed in "Other Natural Areas" (Alberta Parks web site, 2012).
