**Notes:** Kakina Lake Natural Area is part of a strongly rolling hummocky moraine dissected from northwest to southeast by a poorly-drained lowland area. Vegetation includes upland balsam poplar forest with some aspen & a dense shrub layer.

The site is in the Boreal Forest Natural Region, Dry Mixedwood Sub-region. The Dry Mixedwood Sub-region is the only Boreal Forest sub-region that does not have excellent representation within Alberta's parks and protected areas network. There are still significant shortfalls in the glacial lakebed, ground moraine, sandplain and sand dune natural history themes. Listed in "Other Natural Areas" (Alberta Parks web site, 2012).
