**Notes:** Lac La Nonne Natural Area has gently to moderately rolling topography with young seral to mature balsam poplar forest with scattered mature white spruce, small stands of mature white birch and scattered small wetlands of sedge (*Carex*); good wildlife habitat. This site is in the Boreal Forest Natural Region, Dry Mixedwood Sub-region. The Dry Mixedwood Sub-region is the only Boreal Forest sub-region that does not have excellent representation within Alberta's parks and protected areas network. There are still significant shortfalls in the glacial lakebed, ground moraine, sandplain and sand dune natural history themes. Listed in "Other Natural Areas" (Alberta Parks web site, 2012).
