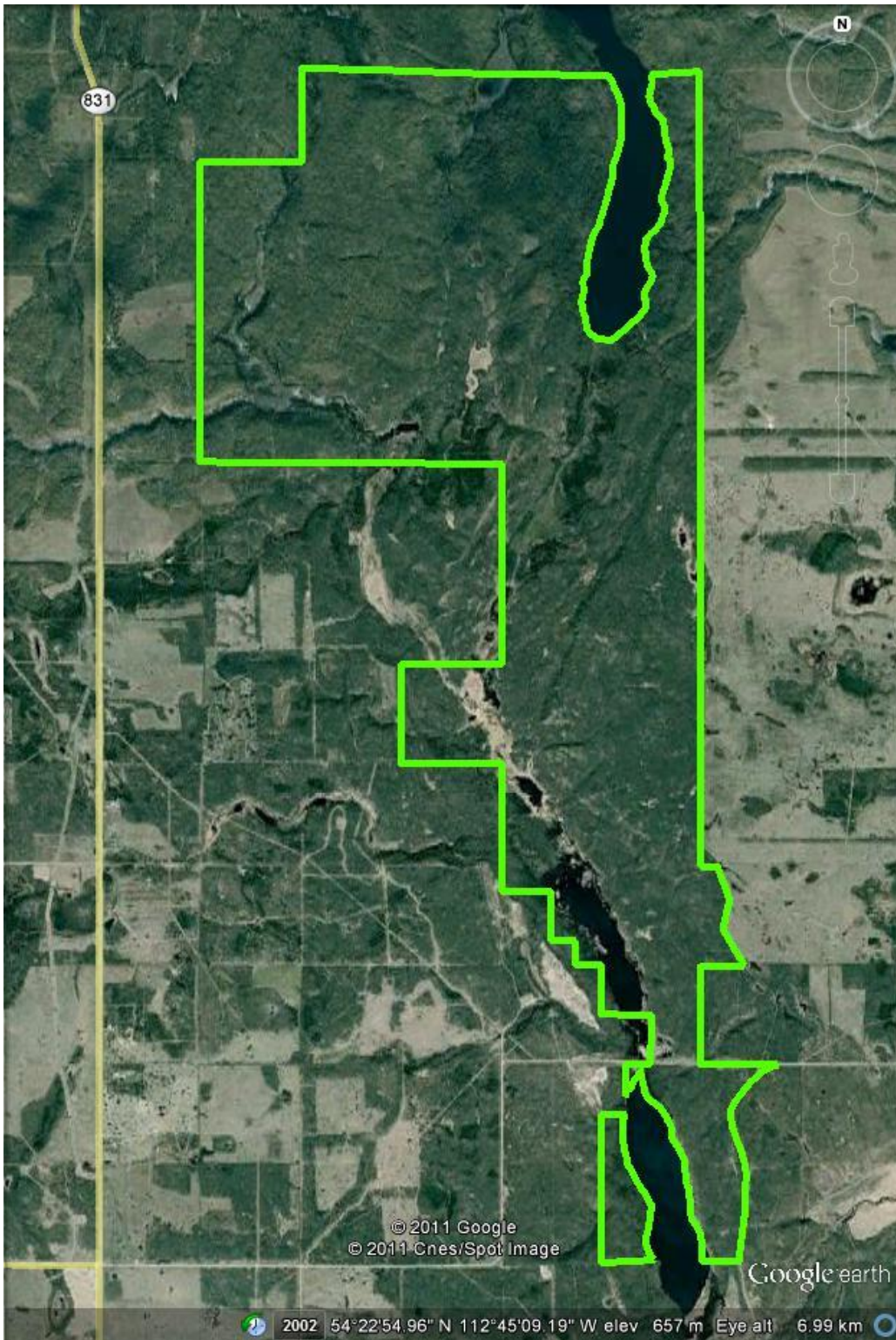


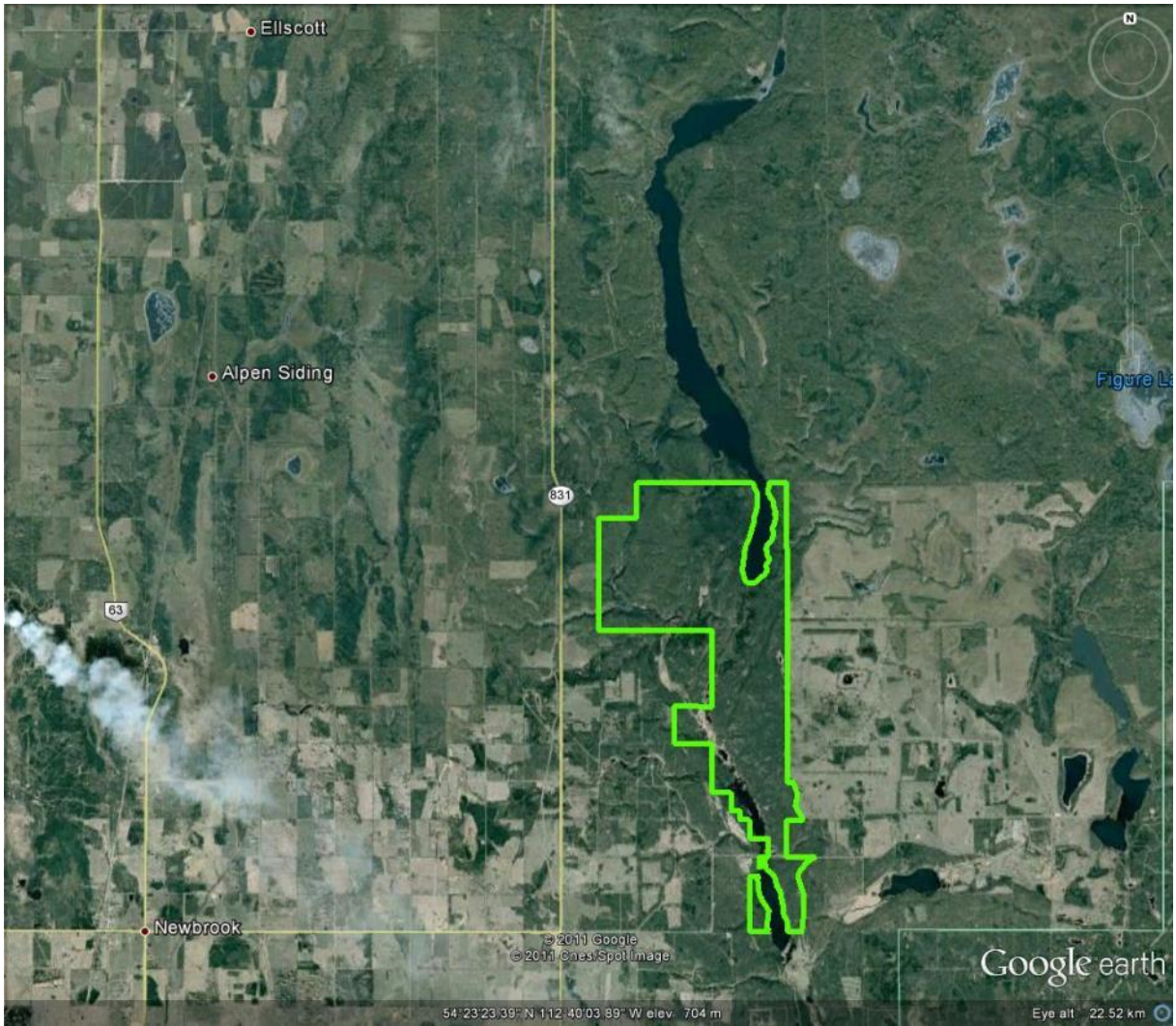

Notes: White Earth Valley Natural Area contains a variety of habitats. Marshes provide habitat for blue herons, loons and a variety of ducks, as well as moose, beaver, muskrat and mink. Perch and northern pike inhabit the lakes. White-tailed and mule deer graze; black bears feed on cranberries, raspberries, saskatoons and blueberries on the hillsides. Wolves and coyotes travel narrow game trails, and in summer, hillsides & meadows are covered with wildflowers, including the western wood lily.

This site lies in the Boreal Forest Natural Region, Dry Mixedwood Sub-region. The Dry Mixedwood Sub-region is the only Boreal Forest sub-region that does not have excellent representation within Alberta's parks and protected areas network. There are still significant shortfalls in the glacial lakebed, ground moraine, sandplain and sand dune natural history themes. Listed in "Other Natural Areas" (Alberta Parks web site, 2012).
